Use rehearsal room tools such as 'Mapping' and 'Ghosting' to activate Shakespeare's language, students will find our Playing Shakespeare workshop to be a stimulating, relevant and challenging day that deepens understanding and can make the curriculum more coherent and meaningful for learners.
